# MARCO EUSEPI

#### **Fioriture**

2023 — 24 Litografia Bulla, Rome with a text by Pier Paolo Pancotto

Litografia Bulla is the oldest artists' lithography studio still in operation. Founded in 1818 in Paris, it found its definitive headquarters in Rome in 1840. It soon became, from the first half of the 1900s, an important point of reference for the artistic community. In 2020, Litografia Bulla opened Passaggi, a large window which opens from the two most historic rooms of the studio, in which the works of artists who have experimented and explored the interesting interweaving of traditional and contemporary graphic techniques are exhibited.


Excerpt from the text by Pier Paolo Pancotto:


"His pictorial production is marked out, from a thematic point of view, by the choice of subjects derived from nature, represented through a close-up of a flower or through a segment of a landscape. Seen from an expressive standpoint, his work is characterized by a language in which the technical knowledge merges with a narrative freedom, whose rapid and casual appearance discloses the result of long and intimate reflections. Variable-sized visions – eventually on a notable and environmental scale – descend from here, where the borders between reality and imagination, figuration and abstraction, is extremely thin, and through which the artist unveils his reflections on the visual and emotional impressions that nature provides him in his daily life. In this processual path, a great relevance is assumed by the investigation of light, at the very core of the present experience.


Fioriture, composed by a series of colour lithographs printed on japanese paper, whose transparency contributes to emphasize Eusepi's research on light, as well as to foster his virtual dialogue with Eastern cultures. Each volume is associated to a monotype which, from a technical profile, stands in between the pictorial – as witnessed by the uniqueness of the print – and the graphic path of the artist. The use of the monotype recurs in some single sheets of medium and large size, which, together with the lithographs, compete the small, though precious, exhibition set up in the antique Bulla laboratory. The wholeness of these papers, from a syntactic perspective, reaffirms Eusepi's poetics, consecrated, from the very beginning, to celebrate the transience of the shapes generated in nature and, emblematically, those of the human existence itself. Such caducity is explicated through the juxtapositions and the overlapping of brushstrokes, either rapid, intermittent, dense or liquid, aimed at expressing the fugacity of a visual or emotional impression, as well as the fragility implicit in any kind of epiphany."













"The colours and materials create such an uninterrupted blurring between the exhibition space and the works shown that, at times, it may seem difficult to distinguish where the painting finishes and where the wall starts: the scraped and irregular walls caused by the passing of time and the protracted closure of the building (for the exhibition, everything has been left as it was, from the original lightning system to the architectonic additions of the last decades, in order not to al- ter the taste of the place) reverberate the artist's lyric becoming part of it and amplifying its values. The exhibition project in Noto and, more generally, the art investigation by Marco Eusepi, unfolds essentially in this continuous interplay between visions and emotions, between memories and contemporaneity."


































# **Cose Viste**

Cose Viste is a two-person exhibition by artists Marco Eusepi and Sergio Sarra that investigates the transformative experience of painting in relation to the experience of the everyday and the ordinary. The ten-meters long shelf, on which the exhibition display developed, was conceived as a timeline of an informal conversation flow, a dialogue by images in which two different point of views are testified.





# **Untitled (The Skin of Matter)**

2021

Video installation, Citylab971, Rome

"The video-installation Untitled (Via Nettunense 167) at CityLab971 in Rome might seem extraneous to the pictorial discourse. In reality, it shows clips taken with the artist's smartphone to the details of the plane trees; the installation thus concludes the exhibition dedicated to the painting process. The images move imperceptibly and are deliberately out of focus, representing the preamble to a pictorial statement. The monitor loops the recordings, dialoguing with the window above. Such juxtaposition is not accidental: it recalls the artist's attitude looking out the window of his study. The artwork is therefore pictorial since it attempts to take an element in order to continue looking at it. In Eusepi's work, the glance is the origin of painting."
